Annual Salute to America at Greenfield Village



A spectacular *Salute to America at Greenfield Village* on the expansive grounds of The Henry Ford will be performed by the DSO from 6 p.m. to 10 p.m. each night starting June 30 through July 3.

The centerpiece of each evening is a joint concert by the Detroit Symphony Orchestra and the Jazz Ambassadors of the United States Army Field Band.

The 1st Michigan Colonial Fife and Drum Corps will parade the concert grounds at 6:45 p.m. The Jazz Ambassadors of the United States Army Field Band will give a pre-concert performance at 7:30 p.m. The grand finale has the DSO playing Tchaikovsky's 1812 Overture,

The grand finale has the DSO playing Tchaikovsky's 1812 Overture, featuring authentic cannon fire and a spectacular fireworks display accompanied by live patriotic music. Performance of the Detroit Symphony Orchestra begins at 8:30 p.m.

The concert stage is in Walnut Grove (approx. 1/2 mile from the front gates of the Village). Comfortable walking shoes are a must, as is dressing for the weather, as the concert will be held outdoors, rain or shine. Seating will not be provided, and it's recommended that people bring folding chairs or lawn blankets. Photography is allowed in all areas of the Village.

VIP Tickets with special parking and seating package are \$75 per person. Ticket prices are \$29 for non-member adults 12+, and \$24.75 for members of The Henry Ford. Tickets for those aged 3-11 are \$16.50 for members and \$19.50 for non-members. Children 2 and under are admitted without charge. The day of event pricing is an additional \$4 per ticket. No refunds, even in the event of inclement weather. Alcoholic beverages aren't permitted unless purchased on site.

A complete list of entrance policies will be included with your tickets, but, it's advisable to check out the policies via thehenryford.org, or call (313) 982 – 6001. Parking is only \$6, and free for members.

Historic Fort Wayne Hosts Vintage Base Ball Tournament

The Historic Fort Wayne Coalition continues its summer events Saturday, July 8 at the Fort, with a *Vintage Base Ball tournament* from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. The Fort's resident team, the Early Risers, will host five other clubs from around the Great Lakes for the tournament, which demonstrates how base ball (in the 19th century the sport was expressed as two words!) was played more than 120 years ago. The teams include: Lapeer Tigers; Union BBC of Dexter; Wyandotte Stars; Champion Hill Toppers from Indiana; and Fallasburg Flats BBC. The Early Risers have been Historic Fort Wayne's team since 2009, and their name is derived from one of the earliest base ball teams in Detroit. Additional dates for the Early Risers playing vintage baseball at the Fort this season include Sunday, August 27 and Sunday, September 17.

Secured parking is \$5 per vehicle. Admission is FREE for this event, but donations will be accepted. Guided tours of the Historic Fort Wayne complex will also be offered each day at 11 a.m. and 2 p.m., priced at \$5 for adults and free for children under 12. The guided tours will include the Star Fort and barracks built in the 1840s, as well as the Spanish-American War Guard House.

The Fort's regular public hours also continue from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. every Saturday and Sunday each weekend now through Sunday, October 29. Secured parking is \$5, and admission is free.

The Detroit Tigers will host the franchise's *15th Annual Negro Leagues Weekend*, June 30 - July 2, hosting the Cleveland Indians at Comerica Park.

On Saturday, July 1 the Tigers will don the throwback uniforms of the Detroit Stars (see Miggy wearing the commemorative uniform, at right) and the Cleveland Indians will suit up as the Cleveland Buckeyes for the second game of the doubleheader, during the 23rd Annual Negro Leagues Tribute Game. The annual Negro Leagues Weekend marks the longest running three-day celebration of its kind in Major League Baseball. The Tigers will pay tribute to several former Negro Leagues players as current and

The Tigers will pay tribute to several former Negro Leagues players as current and former Tigers players and special guests all come together for a weekend full of events celebrating the contributions of Negro Leagues players to the game of baseball.

Other events include the 11th Annual Detroit Stars Singing Competition. The competition will take place at Friday, June 30's game at the Big Cat Court and will be hosted by Tune Up of Radio One's WDMK 105.9 FM starting at 5:30. Also taking place will be the "Passing of the Bat Ceremony", which embodies the past, present and future contributions of African American ballplayers to the game of baseball and includes ballplayers from many eras of Detroit baseball, including Walt Owens, Rod Allen, Willie Horton and Jake Wood.

All kids 14 and under will receive a Justin Upton poster and the Tigers will present former Tiger Gary Sheffield with the 2017 Detroit Tigers Willie Horton African American Legacy Award at the Sunday, July 2 game.

The Tigers will offer an exclusive Negro Leagues Weekend ticket package, which includes a game ticket, a Detroit Stars Fedora and a donation to the Friends of the Historic Hamtramck Stadium- a group dedicated to preserving the field used by Negro Leagues teams, including the Detroit Stars.

The Great Lakes Chamber Music series is over for this year, the 24th year of its existence. It has grown a lot since its beginning and we have grown with it. We are looking forward to next year, the 25th, with anticipation towards the future.

This week we got to hear world class musicians, such as cellist Clive Greensmith, violinist Leila Josefowicz, pianist Ran Dank, as well as the Emerson String Quartet. The closing night of the Festival took place on Saturday, June 24th, at Seligman.

I have heard Schoenberg's Verklarte Nacht (Transfigured Night) Op. 4, performed before by the DSO. Hearing it performed in a chamber group setting was a completely different experience, with the different voices and atmospheres being built up individually (Josefowicz, Philip Setzer, violists Cindy Wu and Eric Nowlin, cellists Clive Greensmith and Paul Watkins).

New pieces by younger composers were of substantial interest, such as Dust by Sean Shepherd (b. 1979), Future Caprices by Will Healy (b. 1990), and the Anthem Quartet by Perry Goldstein (b. 1952). As a special event taking place after the actual Festival, James Tocco and his daughter Rhova Tocco Didden will be performing at the Vignette Series taking place at St. Hugo of the Hills on Saturday, July 22, at 7:30 p.m. This is part of a fundraiser effort with tickets being \$75 each.

Featured will be excerpts from Poulenc's *The Story of Babar.* For more informa-

In addition to being involved in the Chamber Music Festival, Paul Watkins conducted the DSO this weekend with Leila Josefowicz (pictured) performing as solo violinist in Stravinsky's *Violin Concerto in D Major*. Her performance style tends to be energetic and full of vitality.

In addition to the Stravinsky, the program included Schumann's *Rhenish Symphony* and opened with Haydn's *Symphony No. 102 in B-flat Major.* Watkins allowed for beautiful nuances into the Haydn, by bringing out rich dynamic modulations in the beginning of the piece. In the Schumann, he portrayed the orchestral richness.

The DSO is preparing to make a tour to Japan and China. Their program includes Cindy McTee's Double Play, Korngold's Violin Concerto and Copland's Symphony No. 3.

A free send-off concert featuring those works will

take place at Orchestra Hall on Sunday, July 9th, 3 p.m. Leonard Slatkin is the conductor and Akiko Suwanai is the solo violinist.

Additional events with the DSO will take place at Greenfield Village for the 4th of July and at the Ford House in Grosse Pointe on July 7th and 8th. For tickets, call (313) 576-5111.

Kerrytown Concert House has taken a very active role in the Chamber Music Festival. The latest of that mini-series events took place last Sunday. This venue provides many exceptional events throughout the year for chamber groups. Notable during the coming month of July is the lecture and performance series provided by world class pianist and educator Louis Nagel. Titled Is this *Haydn or Mozart,* Nagel will be giving lectures on July 12th and 15th, with following performances on July 13th and 16th.



Film of Detroit's Venerable Father Solanus



The Solanus Casey Center in Detroit will premiere an SWC film that features extraordinary stories about Venerable Solanus Casey, a humble friar who was credited with miraculous cures and valued for his wise and compassionate counsel on Sunday,

The Fabric of Survival: Holocaust Art in WB

The Janice Charach Gallery in West Bloomfield will host one of its most significant exhibits, The Fabric of Survival: The Art of Esther Nisenthal Krinitz on July 16 through September 19. The exhibit of 36 handmade fabric panels, depicts Esther Krinitz's struggle to survive in Nazi occupied Poland.

The Opening Reception will take place on Sunday, July 16 from 1 to 3 p.m. It's free and open to the public. Docents from the Holocaust Memorial Center will be available for questions during the opening.

Esther Nisenthal Krinitz, along with her sister Mania, were the only members of their family and among the few Jews in their village, to survive the Holocaust. Nearly 40 years later, Esther's haunting memories led her to create extraordinary works of art using the techniques of embroidery, fabric applique and stitched narrative captioning. Thirty four of these remarkable panels, with vivid colors and striking details, reveal a young girl's struggle to survive in Nazi occupied Poland and her ultimate escape to freedom in America.

The exhibit at the Janice Charach Gallery will take place in conjunction with a series of programs that feature films, speakers and workshops designed to enhance the appreciation and experience of Esther's art and understanding of genocide.

The crowd was treated to what are now seen as legendary moments in rock history: Jimi Hendrix playing guitar with his teeth and tongue, and lighting it on fire, The Who's first major U.S. appearance, which ended with smoke bombs going off and Pete Townshend smashing his guitar and kicking over the drum set before leaving the stage; Ravi Shankar's four-hour set; and Otis Redding's last performance before dying in a plane crash less than six months later.
